SILVER IN THE WORLD WORING WORLD IN THE 2XPR3 MIX

The duo Diana Barcelos and Júnior Silva won the silver medal in the Double Skiff Mixed PR3 (2x PR3 Mix) at the 2022 Senior Rowing World Championship, in Racice, held in September. The event is the main competition on the World Rowing calendar.

The race was very challenging for the Brazilian duo. Early on, Diana's shovel caught on one of the buoys, causing the boat to stop in the lane. Without thinking about giving up, the Brazilian athletes realigned the double skiff and in a few seconds they restarted the race in last place. At the 500m line, they crossed in fourth position.

In an impressive recovery, the Brazilian duo managed to climb to 3rd position in the 1000m and fight with the Ukrainian boat for 2nd place. At the finish line, our rowers crossed at the 2nd

position with 0.02s of advantage confirmed in the photo finish. The duo impressed everyone with their dedication and resilience and commitment to represent Brazil fighting until the end and they promise that they will continue training hard for the next medal for the country to be golden!

3.1 CBI OF YOUNG TALENTS I



The Young Talents CBI was held in 2022 in its traditional format, being the youngest competition on the Brazilian rowing calendar.

Athletes up to 18 years of age compete in 1000 and 1500 meter races in the Raia da Ilha do Pavão, at the headquarters of Grêmio Náutico União, host of the event, in the capital of Rio Grande do Sul.

Almost 100 athletes from ten clubs across the country gathered in Porto Alegre for a program of 12 competitions.

The Francisco Martinelli Club, from Florianópolis (SC), was the great champion of the first stage of the CBI of Young Talents of Rowing 2022,

closely followed by Clube de Regatas do Flamengo (RJ).

The event took place between March 30th and April 2nd. The Final Events of the event were held on Saturday, 02/04, with the participation of 71 athletes from 10 clubs.

The Young Talents CBI was held by CBR in partnership with Remosul and Grêmio Náutico União.

The First stage of the Young Talents opened the calendar of national competitions and warmed up the athletes for the second stage of the Championship that took place in the second half of 2022.

3.2 SHORT BOAT CBI

The USP Olympic Race, in São Paulo, once again hosted the Brazilian Short Boat Interclub Championship! After two years without hosting the traditional Single Skiff and Two Without

Timoneiro events, the capital of São Paulo returns to the Remo Brasil calendar. The trials took place in May with 199 entries representing 31 clubs from 12 states.

With a different regulation from the CBI of long boats, this competition has two phases. 23, Lightweight and Senior competed in the same event. This phase also worked with the National Selection for entry into the Brazilian Rowing Team. Botafogo (RJ) was champion in the two women's competitions and Corinthians (SP) won the two men's trophies.

In the second phase, CBI of Short Boats, the disputes were by categories, with the six best placed of the tests carried out in Phase 1. There were disputed 18 Olympic tests and 6 more tests in the Paralympic categories. Flamengo (RJ) ended the competition leading the Olympic ranking, followed by Botafogo (RJ) and Corinthians (SP). In Para - Remo, Aldo Luz (SC) and Pinheiros (SP) ended the competition tied for first place.

The total number of registered athletes remained at the same levels as the events before the pandemic, with an increase in the number of women. Of the 65 registered women, 44% are in the Junior A and Junior B categories, that is, almost half are beginner athletes.

3.3 CBI OF LONG OWING AND PARA-OWING BOATS

The Rowing CBI, organized by CBR, had the Olympic lane of Lagoa Rodrigo de Freitas as the stage and the city of Rio de Janeiro as the headquarters and had 286 registered athletes from 21 clubs in cities such as Rio de Janeiro, São Paulo, Vitória, Recife, Natal, Belém, Brasília, Florianópolis, Porto Alegre and Pelotas.

Highlighting that the competition follows the same pattern as last year, with gender equality in the tests, with the same number of female and male tests.

Flamengo (RJ) won the CBI of Long Boats in the two modalities of Rowing and Para - Rowing. In the Olympic category, Clube Rubro Negro was followed by Botafogo (RJ) in second place and in the Paralympic category, followed by

Pinheiros (SP) and Vasco da Gama (RS).

For Magali Moreira, president of CBR, the competition was a success and met expectations: "Whenever we hold a Brazilian championship, the expectation we have is that the competition that was held in the previous year will be surpassed. For this, we try to do and make available what is best for the athletes to feel as close as possible to what they would have in an international competition, such as a photo finish lighting system, marking the lane in perfect condition, placing the boats in the water with the highest security and arbitration catamarans.

This year, we also put up a screen so that athletes and the public can follow all the races from the start to the finish".

3.4 CBI OF YOUNG TALENTS II

The second stage of the youngest Championship on the Brazilian rowing calendar was missed. Athletes from all over the country, showed that despite their young age, the new generation of rowers is coming with full force and with a lot of drive and determination.

Held between the 4th and 6th of November, the competition brought together on Ilha do Pavão, in the capital of Rio Grande do Sul, 150 athletes up to 18 years of age from all over the country, representing 15 clubs.

The ten events of the CBI program for Young Talents were disputed row by row and Flamengo was the champion, taking seven gold medals, two in mixed teams.

Centro Português won two gold medals in two mixed boats with the Flamengo team. GNU, Martinelli and Mercedes, from Uruguay, won a gold medal each. There were three days of competitions: two of qualifiers and one of finals and lots and lots of emotion.

It is worth remembering that Mercedes' score, as it is a Uruguayan club, is not included in the official ranking of medals for the event, as well as medals for mixed teams, in accordance with the regulations of the CBI for Young Talents.

The Young Talents remains faithful to its original purpose: to provide a greater number of competitions for the Basic Categories, encouraging participation in short and long boats, in a constructive competition that promotes greater engagement of rowers and technicians.

3.5 MASTER BRAZILIAN



Lagoa Rodrigo de Freitas received more than 200 athletes from all over Brazil for the competition with the highest number of events of the year. There are 174 races, in 100 downhill races, all at a distance of 1000 meters, in the Brazilian Masters Championship. It is worth remembering that more than one age category can be included in the same lane run with different awards. The event was held in November.

As with CBI Longboats, mixed teams from more than one club are allowed. With six-minute intervals between races, the Brazilian Master's Championship stirred up Lagoa Rodrigo de Freitas and brought a lot of emotion to the spectators of the event.

The most experienced active athlete in the world, according to World Rowing, Odilon Maia Martins, from Martlinelli, competed and won in two events, the single skiff (1x) category M, for athletes aged 89 and over, and the double skiff (2x). The 1975 Pan American Champion, Gilberto Gerhardt, from Amares, also competed in this Brazilian in five races.

A four without male helmsman (4-M) beyond special returned to Lagoa Rodrigo de Freitas during the event. Originally formed to compete in the first Latin Cup held in 1976 at Lagoa Rodrigo de Freitas, athletes Raul Bagattini (vogue), Guilherme Campos (sota vogue), Marcelo Collin (sota front) and Erico Vicente (lead) met again to present in this Brazilian, thrilling all spectators.

3.6 NORTH NORTHEAST ROWING CUP



Rio Grande do Norte, represented by the North-Riograndense Rowing Federation (FNR), was the champion state of the Copa Norte Nordeste 2022. According to the regulation of the event, the state with the most victories wins the A Tarde cup. This season, the hosts of the competition came out on top, with FNR lifting the trophy.

There were twelve races with the right to turns in the last 500 meters of the race and arrivals that gave work to the arbitration team. After two years, the Copa Norte Nordeste returned to the national rowing calendar, promising more emotions for the year 2023. Highlight for EC Vitória, from Bahia, the club that won the most number of first places per team and won the regatta, being the club

champion of the North Northeast Cup.

The oldest competition in Brazilian rowing, the first edition of the event was held before the founding of the CBR itself, the Taça A Tarde has been disputed since 1961 and its replica is given to the State that wins the Copa Norte Nordeste on a temporary basis. The original trophy, for security reasons, is kept at the Banco do Governo in the State of Bahia, as it is made of silver.

The Copa Norte Nordeste de Remo was created by the Federation of Clubes de Regatas da Bahia and Jornal A Tarde, with the support of the Spanish Community of Salvador. Since then, the states represented by their clubs, has been disputing the competition that brings historical rivalries every year. For clubs in the North Northeast, the event is much more than a competition program.

3.7 1st BRAZIL BEACH ROWING CUP

Canasvieiras beach, in Florianópolis, was the scene of a lot of emotion with the holding of the 1st Copa Brasil de Remo de Praia! The events took place on February 5th and 6th, with the participation of more than 70 athletes who competed in the events in individual and relay categories.

The event took place at the Arena Curta Mais Floripa. The tests were carried out in teams of pairs, all using the same model of boats: the Single Skiff Coastal from the Swift brand.

For the 17-year-old athlete from Flamengo, Alice Andreino, the event was a new experience. "Very cool! I'm enjoying it a lot, the beach here is better than the one in Rio. Yesterday there were waves, it was cooler, with more adventure to compete. Today [Sunday] it was calmer, as we are used to. I'm loving the event," said the athlete.

BEACH SPRINT FORMAT: The events were held in the beach sprint modality, a novelty in rowing. The starting line is in a portal set up on the beach, from where the athlete runs about 50m to reach his boat. From there, it's 250m going around buoys in slalom style and the return in a straight line to the beach, where the rower must run again on the sand to the finish line.

The Copa Brasil de Remo de Praia was organized by CBR in partnership with the Rowing Federation of the State of Santa Catarina (FERESC) and had the support of Curta Mais Floripa, the City Hall of Florianópolis, Association of Federations of SC (AFESC) and ND Group.

4.1 WORLD COAST CHAMPIONSHIP

Paralympic rower André Arthur Dutra represented Brazil in the last edition of the World Backpacking Championship held in Wales, in October, organized by World Rowing.

The athlete, who is also the president of the Rowing Federation of Santa Catarina (Feresc), returned excited with his result and with the information that his PR3 category should be included in the next editions of the event.

"I was the only Paralympic athlete in

competition and rowed well. Because of my disability, I have a disadvantage when it comes to running to the boat. With the inclusion of my category, my result can be even better", explains André.

The rower finished the competition in seventeenth place in his time trials battery of the CM1x, beach sprint boat.

Another Brazilian, Marcelo Neves, was also present at the competition, as one of the technical delegates of the Coastal Commission of World Rowing.

4.2 SOUTH AMERICAN ROWING JUNIOR AND SUB23



The 2022 South American Rowing Championship, held in Rio Grande do Sul and organized by CBR in partnership with CSAR and GNU, had a program that had eighteen events: six Paralympics and 12 Olympics.

The competition took place on the edge of Ilha do Pavão, in Porto Alegre, during the month of March.

The Brazilian team won 5 gold, 13 silver and 9 bronze medals. In the official ranking of the championship, Brazil was in 4th position, behind Argentina, Chile and Uruguay.

In the official medal table, Brazil took a gold medal, 11 silver and 9 bronze.

In para-rowing, only the Single Skiff PR1 races counted towards the championship score, the other races are extra to the official program of the event.

The 2022 South American Rowing champion trophy honored athlete Dulce D'Avila Bandeira. Rower of Grêmio Náutico União, she was the first Brazilian woman in history to climb to the highest place on the podium in the Single Skiff race in Brazilian championships.

The runner-up trophy was named after Breno Manczck, the GNU coach who taught Dulce to row and took her to the Troféu Brasil de Remo, the name of the Brazilian rowing championship in the 1980s.

4.3 III WORLD CUP

The Brazilian Rowing Team ended its participation in the 3rd Stage of the Rowing World Cup 2022, held in Lucerne, Switzerland during the month of September. Our athletes competed in four competitions in the Women's Single Skiff (W1x), Men's Two Skiff (M2-) and Lightweight Women's Double Skiff (LW2-) categories, reaching the Final C of the competition.

At Dois Sem Masculino (M2-), the country was represented by athletes Alef Fontoura and Bernardo Boggian. The duo took 5th place in the Elimination phase and went on to the Repechage, where they won 4th place. With this result, the rowers went on to Final C and ended up in 6th place, 18th place in the general ranking of the category.

Also in Dois sem Masculino, the duo David Faria and Vangelys Reinke took 5th position in the Elimination heat and went on to the Repechage. Again in fifth place, the duo went to Final D and ended the race in 3rd place, 21st in the overall ranking.

The rower Beatriz Tavares was our representative in the Female Single Skiff (W1x). The Brazilian took 4th place in the elimination heat and went on to the Repechage, taking fourth place again. Classified for Final C, Beatriz ended the race with the 2nd position, 14th place in the general ranking of the category.

4.4 WORLD SENIOR ROWING

The Brazilian Rowing Team was represented by 8 athletes. Two Olympics and six Paralympics, who competed in five events at the 2022 World Senior Rowing Championships, held in Racice, Czech Republic, in September.

Among the highlights of the Brazilian representatives is the duo formed by Diana Barcelos, from Flamego, and Valdeni da Silva Júnior, from Martinelli, who won the silver medal in the double skiff PR3 mixed (2x PR3 Mix), the test has already been confirmed as a novelty of the 2024 Paralympic Games program in Paris. In the Olympic modality, highlight for the two without female light weight helmsman (2-

WPL), by the duo Luana Fagundes and Isadora Greve, who finished the competition in fourth place in the final A. The two rowers are from GPA in Rio Grande do Sul. Claudia Santos, from Pinheiros, also qualified for the final A of her race, the single skiff PR1 (1X WPR1), finishing the World in sixth place overall.

The double skiff PR2 Mix (2xPR2 Mix) by Josiane Lima and Leandro Sagaz, both from Clube Aldo Luz, won first place in final B and finished the competition in seventh place. Renê Pereira, from the São Salvador club, felt a back injury, and for this reason, he decided not to compete in this World Cup anymore.

4.5 WORLD UNDER 23 AND JUNIOR

The Brazilian team participated in the 2022 Junior and Under 23 World Rowing Championship held in Varese, Italy. The team made up of 11 athletes competed in seven competitions, with the best result being 6th in the Final A of Dois Sem Peso Leve Under 23 (BLM2-), in a boat formed by Iago Rodrigues and Luiz Felipe Faria.

For the technical commission and the athletes who participated in the event, the balance of results was positive, but the taste is that I want more!

According to CBR's Technical Manager, Marcello Varriale, this group of new athletes showed commitment and maturity during training and competition and this shows that the future is promising.

RENEWAL: "This World Cup group was formed by a new generation of Brazilian athletes who show that the country's rowing renewal is happening in a positive way. They are rowers who are still in the first or second year of their categories and were absurdly competitive evidence", explains Varriale.

The example of this was the participation of the Double Skiff Sub 23 Lightweight team of Pietro Tuchtenhagen and Marcelo Almeida, who conquered the 10th place overall in the ranking, staying out of Final A for less than two seconds. It was the athletes' first international experience as a duo and Marcelo's first participation in World Cups, in one of the most disputed Olympic competitions in this cycle for the Paris Games.

4.6 ODESUR GAMES



Twenty athletes made up the Brazilian Rowing Team for the Odesur Games, held in October, in Conceição, Paraguay.

The rowers represented Team Brazil in this multi-sport event in nine competitions. Winning three silver and three bronze medals.

Highlight for the boats that went up to the podium like the four without male light weight helmsman (4- M PL), who lost the gold medal by less than ten hundredths of a second to the Chilean team. The boat was formed by athletes from Flamengo and Botafogo.

The team's other silver medals came in the women's single skiff boat (1xF) by Beatriz Tavares, from Botafogo, and the women's four skiff (4XF) formed by athletes from Botafogo and Flamengo.

Betariz Tavares' medal was the 100th won by Team Brasil at the Odesur Games.

Bronze medals were won in the senior women's double skiff (2xF), lightweight men's double skiff (2xMPL) and senior men's single skiff (1xM) events.

The other Brazilian boats won fourth place, such as the four without a helmsman (4-M) and the eight with a helmsman (8+M) for men, both in the senior category, and the female senior lightweight double skiff (2xFPL).

5.1 RIO INTERNATIONAL REGATTA

The Rio International Regatta took place in the Olympic lane at Lagoa Rodrigo de Freitas between the 22nd and 23rd of October, together with the 2022 CBI Para-Remo. The event was held in partnership with World Rowing during the Desafio das Águas. The competition was a form of incentive and promotion of the modality between the countries of South America and North America.

The International Regatta was held concurrently with the Para rowing CBI in single events

skiff (1x) female and male category PR1 and mixed double skiff (2x mix) PR3 and the World Rowing Para Camp.

World Rowing instructors were present in Rio de Janeiro to give training classes to coaches from Brazil and from countries in South America, Mexico and Canada as a way of promoting and encouraging the qualifying race for Paris 2024.

The countries present at the event were Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Ecuador, Mexico, Paraguay, Peru and Uruguay. World Rowing brought a coach and two athletes from each country to encourage the sport.

5.2 CT JUNIOR AND UNDER 23 - Phase 1

CBR held a training camp for the Junior and Sub23 categories, seeking the development of crews for the South American Junior and Sub23 Championship, scheduled to be held in Porto Alegre at the end of March, and the development of a team aimed at the Championship Junior and U23 World Championships in 2022, with emphasis on improving the Remo4 Program.

This boot camp involved all classes and categories of the Sulamericano Júnior and Sub23, and the athletes were selected taking into account:

- a) South American athletes Junior and Senior 2021; b) athletes who have won

relevant result in short boats in the Brazilian championship;

- c) athletes who have achieved relevant results in training camps, ergometric evaluations or long boats in the 2021 season.

The group of athletes summoned was widely discussed with technicians involved in this summons and submitted for analysis by the Competition Panel.

For reasons of safety and prevention of contagion due to the increase in positive cases of Covid19, during the period of this CT, the training camp was held with the group divided between Porto Alegre and Rio de Janeiro.

5.4 CT JUNIOR AND UNDER 23 - Phase 2

As foreseen in the planning described in the document Path of Selection 2022, the Training Camp for the Junior and Sub23 categories, of the Remo4 Program and CBR Base Nucleus, was carried out from May 23 to June 11, with the objective of improving and assessment of athletes and crews for participation in the 2022 Junior and U23 World Championships and future competitions.

The athletes were selected according to relevant results in the Championship Brasileiro and Selective Short Boats, held in early May and in the

rowing ergometer evaluations planned for the season and according to the prospect of results in the target championship.

5.5 TRAINING COURSE FOR PAWER TRAINER



The Para-Remoting Coordination of CBR, with the support of the Brazilian Paralympic Committee (CPB), carried out four training courses for Level 1 Para-rowing Coaches.

The four courses were held in Brasília (DF), Natal (RN), Recife (PE) and Porto Alegre (RS). The objective is to extend training to all rowing centers in Brazil, following the structural basis of the National Development System.

The premise is to prepare professionals to welcome athletes interested in participating in the practice of rowing in Brazil.

Classes were divided into theoretical and practical parts, where participants could interact with boats and athletes.

For the president of the Federation of Brasilia de Rowing, Lília de Oliveira, the courses were important to spread the modality and reach new sectors to implement para-rowing and seek new partnerships.

On average, five coaches were approved in each course, where they were qualified with the certificate given by the CBR as Para-Remo Coach, level 1. There are still levels 2 and 3 in the CBR coach training program.

For the coordination of the modality, a propitious environment for the practice of the sport begins with the education of the coaches, so that they develop appropriate activities together with their clubs and that this course is the first step for the dissemination of the para rowing modality throughout the whole world. country.

6.2 WOMEN IN SPORT HIGH PERFORMANCE PATHWAY

In November, Brazilian coach Leticia Muziol and three other foreign rowing coaches began their learning journey as part of a 21-month WISH – Women in Sport High Performance Pathway program. The program started with a residential week at the University of Hertfordshire, UK.

WISH aims to support women coaches to progress to high performance coaching roles in national, continental and international competitions. WISH is supported by Olympic Solidarity, the University of Hertfordshire and a number of International Federations and National Olympic Committees.

Under the motto “Empowering Women Coaches”, 21 women spent the week immersed in activities designed to further develop their leadership skills, confidence and career.

Representing 11 sports and 17 countries, the coaches were selected by their International Federations (IFs) and National Olympic Committees (NOCs) for their individual achievements, potential and ambition.
